

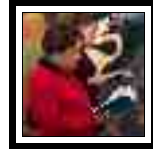

Dear Praying Friend,

Although Independent Baptist Church of Georgetown (IBCG) has recently been saddened by the move of several members and frequent guests away from the church, we rejoice to know we are still walking in the light of God's countenance, and we are confident God will continue to bless as He has in the past.

Since our last letter, there is much to report. By God's grace, we voted to support two new church planters, bringing the total number of IBCG-supported missionaries and church planters to eight. In February, we were excited when a lady named Iris joined the church. Iris had been attending for more than eight months, so her decision came as a bit of a surprise, but what a wonderful surprise it was! Later, in March, we were privileged to host



Evangelist Oliver Araiza and his family for a three-day spring revival. Brother Araiza's preaching proved to be challenging and encouraging to the members of the church and to those (three) who attended from the community. Finally, we praise God that a young man from Korea, CJ, was saved during a visit to his family's auto repair shop. CJ lives a little distance from IBCG, so we will be directing him to a church in the suburbs.



Some of our most exciting news comes from Cameroon, Africa. As you may remember from our August 2004 letter, we asked you to pray for the Webb family. The Webb's joined IBCG shortly after its inception and later moved to Cameroon for Mr. Webb to work at the U.S. embassy. As it turns out, God has since used the Webb's to help lead as many as 60 Cameroonians to the Lord. The Webb's are currently conducting Bible studies for the new converts, but they, as well as the members of IBCG, are praying God will send someone to Cameroon to start a new church. In what appears to be a possible answer to our prayers, a displaced missionary from the volatile Ivory Coast will be visiting the Webb's April 8-12 to determine if God would have him start the new work. Please pray that God will definitively show him whether or not he should move. If it is not God's will, we ask you to pray that God will soon send the right man to meet this great need.
